Serious infectious diseases have not gone away. There is something you can do. Vaccines, also called needles or injections, can keep your baby safe.



Any Concerns?

It's okay to have questions about vaccines. Lots of parents do. Don't ever be afraid to ask.

You want what's best for your baby, and so do your doctor and nurse. Your Traveller Primary Health Care Worker is there to listen and connect you to the right information.

Vaccines Protect

When your baby gets their vaccines, their immune system works with the vaccines to make sure the vaccines protect them. This is a tiny amount of work for your baby's immune system compared to what it does every single day, dealing with the millions of germs that are in the world around them.





What to Expect

It's normal for babies to feel the following things after vaccines:

Tired



Sore

Baby Vaccine Schedule

Changes to the baby vaccine schedule are made over time. This is to make sure children are offered the best protection.

Remember to give your baby 3 doses of liquid infant paracetamol after the 2 and 4 month MenB vaccines.
